The Greek coins, because of their small number, are arranged by mint alphabetically instead of geographically. The weights are given in grams. Weights are only given, however, when the coin is sufficiently well preserved to make them of significance. Even when given, for the bronze pieces, they must be interpreted very liberally because of the effect of corrosion and cleaning.

The size given is the maximum diameter in centimeters. Most of the coins of Manuel and a few others are not round so that the maximum diameter may be considerably greater than the mean diameter, which, however, could be established only by unwarrentable care.

In cataloguing the coins of Manuel we have made no attempt to indicate how much of the types is visible on each coin. That is sufficiently shown on the accompanying cards. But all traces of inscriptions have been recorded as they appear.

There is no such coin published, but:

1. The head is obviously Claudian
2. Corinth, Athens, Sparta and possibly Petraea were the only Greek towns coining during his reign.
3. No such type is known at Athens or Sparta
4. A similar reverse type occurs at Corinth under Trajan (BMC p 73 No 588) and Hadrian (Nomismatic Commentary on Paesaniae p 16)


