Thess. invaded, Boet & Thesbes after
Thermop., Pelop. not fully up. in
any & many lost fields, Argos
neutral (not quite benevolently neutral),
perh. worst p. all was attitude of Del.
To say least of it it was ambiguous
contradict. oracle & its fine temple
while Ath. was given to flames & rose
as phoenix. Del. escaped blunder
& destruction, unknown fact later.

"The god has interfered" was excuse.
most fatal source of division in

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all was politics. rivalry & art of Sp.
Confliction & com. in chief, Ath-
wart sea land, most allies dead.
to follow: Ath raised question &
comes out vict. under sp. lead. But
quest. comes sooner or later -
Essential contact & rivalry -
Sp-Ath really both fully entitled
to be taken as rep. of Hell as its
best but neither quite exhausts
the typology of Hellas. Neither
final or complete, mutually com-

of each. Acc. to Herodotus as early as
⁵⁶⁰ days of C. Solon was rec. as nine
