### Revolutionary Sp (wrong title)

Should be Sp. during Rev. period, far less infl. by Rev than Eng. Seas unite & mts. divide, Sp. is essentially insular, only 3 passes. Interpenetration of ideas slow. Power of cong. Fr. could not hold Fr. too. Visigoths cut by Pyr. "Gr. armies must starve, small must be cong" Henri IV. Only faint echo of rev. in Sp. or colonies.

Ch III 1759-66 one of best monarchs, energetic. More progress than in any period rec. recent. Prosper. 90. since palmy days, good navy, 112 gun ships envoy of Brit. officers. Swift as well as armed.

Ch IV weak, spiritless, Louisa Maria Parma a disgrace. No


one has done more harm than she,  
great scandal. Crisis w. Eng 1790  
On coast of Vancouver, trade  
Chinese & Ind. thro' Brit, compl.  
claims of Eng & Spain, Pitt was  
furious at insults as Sp. claimed  
sovr. on Pacific up to Alaska  
Very important (but neglected),  
who was to have whole coast?  
Family compact (1759) still held  
good. Pitt detestable use of a  
little money in Paris. Affairs  
in Rev. unsuccessful, Mirabeau  
wished to avoid war. Palmer  
skillfully misled by Elliot & others  
Eng gold in one pocket? Sp.  
gold in the other. If Fr. + Sp.  
it must be nation + nat. & not  
king + king. Disgusted auto-  
crats in Madrid, absurd claims

rather than asso. w. democ. France -  
Eng. got none.

1793 royalists of Toulon got upper  
hand, Adm. Hood invited into harbor.  
followed by Sp. Both making  
war vs. same power. Sp. troops  
very unsatisfactory, moved from  
Rousillon bec. gen. wanted to  
get rid of them, a scandalous lot.  
Bonap. appears & bombards Eng &  
Sp. troops & ships. Relief from  
Naples (bad) Sardinia (very good).  
Sept - Dec. trouble bet Brit & Sp.  
officers. Nap. captured Ft Mulgran  
the strategic point, then Toulon  
was evacuated. Bad feeling  
bet Eng & Sp. When Hood went  
to Corica Sp. did not like it.  
Span. did little more in war  
w. defence of Catalonia vs.  
Russ.

Peace of Basle, Fr. offered to give  
back claims in Sp but claimed  
Op. part of San Domingo, West  
part <sup>W</sup> had been taken by Brit. from  
St. France, Sp. didn't like it -  
Cancelled S. D. to France - that  
made more friction between Sp.  
War 1796 causes - Corsica, San D,  
pirateries. Nelson's dispatches  
& correspondence shows he foresaw  
events, that war was coming  
"Dons can make ships, but not  
men." might do something  
brilliant vs. Sp. who could  
line up ships. Corsican trouble  
made Eng. feel they must  
withdraw unless they kept a  
fleet in Med. They did with-  
draw but got revenge in St.



he had 1/2 them. Hairpin format.




Nelson alone went vs. Span. mass

49t. Sp. ships capt. by 15 Brit  
Moral results more important

1802 Peace of Amiens - Nap. gained  
at expense of Span. allies - Gave  
no Fr. territ. to Eng but made  
Span. give up Trinidad - Dutch  
give up Ceylon; they had to pay  
price of Brit: successes at sea.  
Dutch on coast of Africa only.  
Remarkable man was precursor  
of Sp. <sup>Amer.</sup> indep., born at  
Caracas in Venezuela, Miranda.  
After Am. war of indep, M. took  
up his idea, Prof R. thinks  
it was that war rather than  
Fr R which roused Sp. colonies.  
A freelance in Am. Rev. he  
wanted freedom for Sp. colonies.  
Came to London, interviews w.  
Pitt who used him to stir  
up discontent in Sp. est. Then  
M. went to France - entered

his army. (1793) Trouble w. his chief  
leaves him in obscurity for a time,  
then again to Pitt. His career  
not a success but passed discon-  
tent. Eng could not afford to  
send much help. Amiens:  
more of a truce - Eng merchants  
saw some old colonies, Tobago,  
had been lost. Nap. would make  
no comm. treaty w. Eng. Also  
dispute about Malta. War 1804  
Sp. tried to be neutral but Nap.  
would not have it. Earlier  
treaty had been defens. - off.  
alliance bet Fr. & Sp (San Ildefonso)  
∴ Nap. asked for Sp. help, Spain  
galleons  
galleons full of w/gods. Eng.  
might supply for Sp. money to  
Fr. must be stopped - Rupture,  
quest for intern. law. Mahan

condones act but says larger  
squad. should have been sent.  
Led up to Traf. after war decl. 1804.  
See sketch of battle. Best  
ships of Sp. + Fr. 33 ships, also  
some large ones St. Trinita (120)  
Vict - Royal Sov (100 each). Brit  
Admir. not believe in big  
ships but good men (also Prof R)



Sp. left Cadiz to  
enter Med. & help  
vs. Italy.

not for any protection vs.  
invasion of England. Nap.  
was busy at this time on Danube.  
Fr + Sp. tacked & started north to  
return to Cadiz bec. saw Nelson  
would not let them through.  
Nelson thought they were going  
to flee into Cadiz, so he did

not draw up for a regular battle,  
he had to adapt his tactics to  
this when he saw they were ready  
for battle. Brit. ships not in  
good even order, Nelson wanted  
to get at them. Little wind,  
rough sea. (cf. tactics at Camperdown)  
Royal Sov. fast, was to be sup.  
by T. but it could not  
come fast ∴ left only Belle.  
& Mars wh. were faster but only  
70's. Belle. got in broadside  
on French - Sp, Dr R. doesn't  
see how RS survived. Contemp.  
letters show format. was not  
regular. Nelson must have  
gone further n. at 1st than  
is generally supposed. Tack  
to centre of line. Ran a  
great risk, not a good ex. to  
copy.

But N. was determined that  
day should be decisive. Ran  
risk of being becalmed and on.  
Do not detract from his fame  
even if not tactically perfect.  
Wonderful results. Have  
disc. Nap. was not Fr. Rev  
which resulted later, 1812.  
In 1808 Nap. began to intervene  
in Sp - cause Sp. nat. rising.

Battle of T. in one sense cause of what  
we have today. Showed Nap. invad.  
of Eng. impossible  $\therefore$  policy = to close  
commerce to Eng. "Cont System".  
Realized height of ambit. at Tilsit  
he & Alex agree to cease mutual  
incl. Denmark & Portugal, Iber. penins  
T of Fontenoyean Fr & Sp. were to  
divide Port. & get it out of way.  
Fr to partition & Sp. to look on, Fr.  
troops cross Pyr & occup. citadels  
inade Port, unless sent to Brazil.  
Partit. did not take place, French  
used this as pretext for hold over  
Iber. penins. Patriots tried to  
shake off yoke. Mural the bean  
scheme came from Italy to help;  
May 2 revolt vs. foreign occupiers.

Great anniversary tho' effort was a failure. Peace at Bayona an infamous piece of perfidy (most of Nap.). Has been placed royal at Madrid, Ferd. acclaimed king, uncle Ch III - queen seemed to resign, after wards denied it. Disputed succession, Nap. asked both father & son to conference invited them to France, in his power Ch was captured, Ferd. was bullied into abdication. This news led to rising at Madrid - all tho' Sp. Like explosion of volcano of hatred vs. dynasty - usurper who sent bro. Joseph from Naples. Didn't want his reforms. Spontaneous rising, provincial & national. One of most magnif. risings in

mod. hist., fierce, turbulent - but a protest by indignant people - Even in Asturias juntas were appt. to administer. Every privateer off coast picked up some grandees who had been sent by junta, taken to London, well rec'd by Canning. Were at war but here were some Sp. to ask Eng. help. C. said Eng. wd. help, war exchanged for friendship. Even Sheridan supported the ministry for helping Spain. Alliance in July lasted till end of war in spite of friction in details. (Toulon, Corica etc) French had treated them abominably too. Sp. had to pay expenses of war. Relig. diff., trouble bet Brit - Sp. armies & officers.

Even in spite of nagging of Brit  
Opposition vs. Pen. War they saw  
it through. Famous episodes  
Saragosa, tenacity (cf. vs. Hannib)  
old city not well defended in  
milit. sense, but held out so that  
French were forced to abandon it.  
Napier tries to make Madrid of S.  
a myth, Prof. Oman shows the  
legend is true & sneers are wrong.  
San Childe Hard. Later city  
was taken but had been destroyed  
by French & took heavy toll of them  
Baleon French 22000 near  
Cadix to rescue those who had  
taken refuge after Trafalgar  
(all Fr. ships finally captured)  
Surrounded & compelled to surrender,  
Joseph had to pack up & flee  
from Madrid to other side Ebro.



Later Nap. came - pract. conq. most  
of Spain. Pride of Spanish after  
their victory at B. said didn't need  
Eng. help. Nap. scattered these  
chattering geese who then saw  
big task before them. Talubera  
<sup>Justa</sup> Sp. gen. had had quarrel w. Wellington  
about troops - W. begged him  
to retire, Sp. refused "unless  
Brit. gen went on his knees". W.  
said "I didn't care a 2<sup>d</sup> damn so  
long as got out of hole it".  
Wisdom of W. in war & also in  
going on his knees - joke to hint  
of Iron Duke here. Battle saved  
by 48<sup>th</sup> regiment. After this &  
trouble at L & W was holier than  
ever; W. retired to Portugal &  
defended it. Sp. many reverses  
in 1809. Portug. better pupils  
than Sp.

1810 crisis & whole struggle is. Napoleonic  
victories everywhere. No signs of  
schism bet N & Alex. After Trajan  
Massena was ordered to Spain  
down valley of Douro (best way  
to Port.) Bonaire Well. dealt him  
terrible blow - On Tagus from  
Bantarem widens to estuary,  
Lisbon on defensible peninsula,  
14 m. north is Torres V a  
defense - 3 miles so. of that is  
another line where trees. New  
up redoubts, 3<sup>d</sup> line (see  
Tennyson) near mouth of  
river so. of Lisbon in case  
city were captured. wonder-  
ful piece of foresight. Mas.  
didn't know of this till 5<sup>th</sup> Dec.  
before. Even Mas. couldn't  
get through T.V. defenses.

There for several weeks, wet weather  
bore off supplies, Port. raiding  
his army. N. went up to Santar-  
em & tried to cut off his supplies  
on E. bank. Gave it up (would  
have had own communc. cut)  
In Feb. retreated after 11,000  
men, started out.

Albuera, small vill. on stream  
road from Seville to Badajoz  
sh. W. was trying to recapture  
for Spain. Sp. general on E. side  
brook, Berford & some Port. on  
other side - B expected Soult to  
cut center - night before battle  
Blake (who had become through  
Spanish) reinforced, kept them  
out of sight, French didn't know  
& made flank attack that  
played into B's hands. (See

Oman, Pen War), Blake wasn't  
entirely ready for Fr. attack  
(Brit vs. Sp. gens.) Cole in reserve  
(at rear) w. fusiliers & Port also  
skewed around & changed  
direction of fighting from N to S to SW  
Napier very unfair to Spanish.  
While gr. fighting was on Lauro  
M with cavalry came in  
on awful charge with gr. des-  
truction. Cole on own respons.  
adv. his men (3 Brit + 4 Port  
regiments + a few Sp. cav. in  
wings). Napier fine rhet.  
treatment of Cole's reserve  
"sumous terms," doesn't give  
whole troop. About 40%  
killed or wounded, most so far.  
Palamanca (complicated)  
Victoria, but Madrid & Bougo

on high road, in gorge bet. heights  
in r. Zadora, empties into Ebro.  
Several lines of low hills one ↘  
This battle decided fate of Spain,  
Joseph & Jourdain fear a flanking  
move, W's superior force  
came very speedily & outflanked  
French, base now = Biscay  
ports & now supreme commander.  
Often Fr. had been manoeuvred  
out of positions without battles.  
French had done pret. to pre-  
vent this:  
  
W. attack on all sides  
Infer. of Fr. in numbers & tact.  
No bridges had been broken, W  
crossed & attacked main front-  
or flank & Sp. at S.E. Graham  
brilliant adv. to Sp. rear

French troops disposed to bear  
advantage, after falling back  
on 2<sup>d</sup> line while King was  
ordered by Jos. to retreat on  
Victoria, artillery & convoy  
of treasures J. had got in Sp.

"only pocket money left."

Cookham in command retreat  
northward, few could escape.

Jos & Jourd lost all guns  
157, baggage convoy & ammuns  
tho' soldiers escaped.

This lost Sp. for France  
irretrievably.

Infl. of Naps efforts on

(1) Sp. Cd. White-Lock's ill-  
fated effort vs. Buenos Aires,  
lost his nerve, Sp. inhab. of  
new worlds act in decided  
manner - De facto R. of Sp.

was Jos. Bonap. Sp colonies  
wouldn't recog. him, movement  
for liberat. spread. Later the old  
system couldn't be reimposed  
on them, refused to follow old  
react. clique of Ferd V. in 1814.

Liberty of Sp. colonies in new W.  
(2) Court of 1812 (see Butler Clarke)

Appeals to Fr. democ. sentiment  
(1791) as vs Napoleon, bastard  
heir to Rev. Phrases recall

Declaration on Rights of man

Sp. patri. of Cadix made it,  
aims of Fr. court democrats.  
<sup>1812-14</sup>

Remained ideal of Sp. liberals  
during react. restoration.

Abol. inquis, feud. etc.

Econ & social life could not  
be reversed even if polit-  
reaction.

Infl. on Europe; 1810 only, <sup>parts of</sup> Sp  
 - West. in Lisbon held out  
 vs. Nap. This touched imag.  
 of other people "humble-minded  
 Prussians" regarded Sp. as an  
 example for future. Stein  
 based on what Sp. had accomp.  
 1812 doubt if Alex wd. have  
 taken up challenge of Nap  
 if he'd known how many  
 troops were in Spain, also  
 gleams of hope like Salamanca  
 vict. when march on Moscow.  
 1813 G. effort for liberation  
 news of Vittoria was cheering -  
 Spain part + genius + bravery  
 of Hill. not only freed Sp.  
 but set example for Europe.  
 When N. was dying said  
 "Sp never ruined me":
