Summary.

P, Z, M. = local products, unified, of 2d stone age men who inhabit lower part of peninsula. & had begun to receive from S. Med. copper & br. obj., glass & idols. Belong to people of Sicil. Br (less advanced) = Siculi of Homer who still occupied S. Italy in time of Θ, one branch of whom went to Sicily (1500-1000) & suppl. founded Sicani. Same race as those of Scoglito near Tar. (falsely called ^{Empulca} Terranau). Palaf. of Pietra shows kinship bet. These & disposes theory of migration of people from Po valley.

Cuma, ³ resembles to P, Z, M., shapes of cups, ansa forata etc. Even into Br & E/A there was a native civil. before coming of Gks. Geom. = earliest Br. Other cases in room (Suorcola) & (Capua) show earliest Br imports = Geom. Buccino: local Br. from Volturnum
