NB corner block, NW end, old

of fire, father S. S. side facing blocks.
Euthystena, top of foundation, then a step

SE end, proj. 3m beyond. Cols. to go on
new 5^o step, see by Acrop. museum.
Method of finishing & lifting. This one
had stood there (no lifting bosses). Col.
are same :: as Latin Parth, but have
sharper edge of flutes. Lead in center
to use for comparison making os.

2 drums = highest set up. Block = step.
See Dörpf vs. Penrose (c. 1892) Petrie's surf.
Smooth finish higher. D. made it base
block of front wall - BHTH says 52cm
unhewed high. 3 cap foundations

solid i'm no red att. cols found at S face, s. remains only of Acr. rock & not found at. 1910 is found in grain line at proper height for corn.

A wall drums, ^{but base} in frieze frieze.

Blocks have kickers to cor. lifting bases on outside (1/2) Acr. rock N of frieze. 5 drums of smaller cols, i am phoenicyle. 40 or so blocks were regarded as stylob. But now as wide as col. Good matching surface at back, wouldn't do for sty.

T clamps too fragment for styl.

Have profile for step, not for styl.

B.i. rejects D's reconstr. Large block used by D for cella wall will do for styl. Ask for col. cut on its top (now bottom, covered up). Blocks in Acr. wall, cut styl. blocks in 2.

This is SW cor. of bottom steps over Parth.

Good LM I b., marine designs, nautical, seamed, sq. amph. (or jar). Rhyton poor imit. of Cretan. Melian clay does not take lustrious paint well. Spouted bowls (der. from Egt plain).




